- · Arrive at least 30 minutes early for each meeting
- Preside at meetings in the President's absence.

Secretary -

- · Keep an accurate, current roll of all club members
- · Serve on the membership committee
- · Call roll and check attendance at all meetings
- · Keep complete and accurate minutes of each meeting
- Arrive at least 30 minutes early to each meeting

Treasurer -

- Keep accurate, up-to-date records of all club funds.
- Report the club's financial condition at each meeting
- · Serve as the Finance Committee Chair
- · Arrive 30 minutes early to each meeting

Reporter -

- Submit interesting reports and pictures to club activities, members and leaders to local newspapers.





<u>Heifer and Steer:</u> Late tags can be ordered for \$33 each from April 6-June 23.

Call 830-563-2442 or stop by the Extension Office.

Payment will be due at the time of *invoicing*, not ordering.

<u>State Fair Goat and Sheep:</u> Late orders accepted now til June 23 at \$28 per head.

<u>Horse Validation:</u> Late orders being accepted on 4HOnline from now until May 1, 2024 and will cost \$20 per horse.







GOLD STAR

Gold Star is the highest achievement award given by the Texas 4-H Youth Development Program through the county 4-H Program. There are a set of minimum guidelines for eligibility. A member must have completed their 9th grade school year before they can apply and must have been in 4-H at least 3 years including the current year.
